hen the University of Washington outsourced maintenance work after \$280 million in renovations at Husky Stadium, members of the union's UW Skilled Trades Bargaining Unit blew the whistle.

Had it not been for their alertness, the outsourcing that ignored their expertise and took their work might have gone on out of sight, out of mind.

The union's unfair labor practice complaint over the outsourcing was scheduled for a hearing this month.

The Husky Stadium incident shows how Federation members can make a difference as the eyes and ears to detect outsourcing.


That's why the WFSE/AFSCME Skilled Labor and Trades Committee has started a new project to detect often-unseen outsourcing.

We need "Outsourcing Watch" now more than ever.

"We're learning that management more and more is outsourcing our work," explained Jeanine Livingston, the union's contract compliance manager.

"During the Great Recession, cuts were made, positions were lost. But now, during the recovery, the body of work is growing along with it. But positions haven't necessarily followed. But the work for the most

Taxpayer Protection Act (HB 1851) 2018

This bill would <u>increase</u> <u>transparency and accountability for</u> <u>dollars spent on government</u> <u>contracts</u>. It would increase the evaluation of costs, require more robust contract monitoring and mandate contract close-out procedures and reports.

Have you heard about plans to outsource all or part of your work?

FACT: The competitive contracting law <u>**REQUIRES</u>** management to give employees <u>**AT LEAST 90 days**</u> advance notice of deciding to contract so we can present alternatives or bid.</u>
