Tools for Sharing Your Story



Public services are under attack. Telling our stories

is how we fight back. We need to tell our elected officials who cuts and furloughs would impact and why NOW is the time to fix Washington's upside down tax code -- the 2nd most unfair in the USA.



Don't violate media policies. Our employers have strict media policies to prevent employees from acting as spokespeople for their agency/college but they *do not* prevent our members from speaking to press or fellow members about issues at work. That's what a union does.



You have the right to speak on behalf of your union about why your job is important, your workload, etc. If speaking to reporter, have them identify you like this: [your name], a WFSE member who works as a [your position] at [your employer] -- or similar so it's clear you're speaking in your capacity as a union member.

- Your name, where you work, why your work is valuable and who depends on it
- How furloughs and drastic budget cuts would impact your ability to do your job, and how the public would be impacted
- Why your legislators should ask the wealthy to start paying their fair share
